Her commitment to education doesn't end in the classroom. As a tour guide at the National WW1 Museum and Memorial, she brings to life the tumultuous events and courageous individuals of the Great War, captivating visitors with her vivid narratives and knowledge. Patti is continuing to "teach" since retiring after 36 years by taking her show-and-tell quilts on the road to groups in Kansas, Oklahoma, Missouri, Iowa, Nebraska, and California.
