

Pumpkin Block BVQG Exchange October 2020

12 ½" x 12 ½" unfinished

Tan-ish Background: Cut 1 12 ½" x 12 ½"

Brown Pumpkin Stem: about 3" x 3"

Variety of orange scraps for pumpkin: about 3" x 8"

Directions:

1. Trace the pumpkin sections and stem onto the paper-side of your favorite fusible web. (Such as Soft Fuse, Lite Steam-A-Seam 2, or HeatnBond Lite.)
2. Roughly cut out the pumpkin sections and stem.
3. Fuse them to the WRONG side of the fabrics.
4. Cut out all the pieces neatly on the solid lines.
5. Peel off the paper backing and put the pieces on the background fabric. Use the picture below as a placement guide.
6. Fuse the pieces in place.
7. Stitch the edges of all the pieces down with your choice of stitch.

NOTES: You only need to make one pumpkin for the block exchange.

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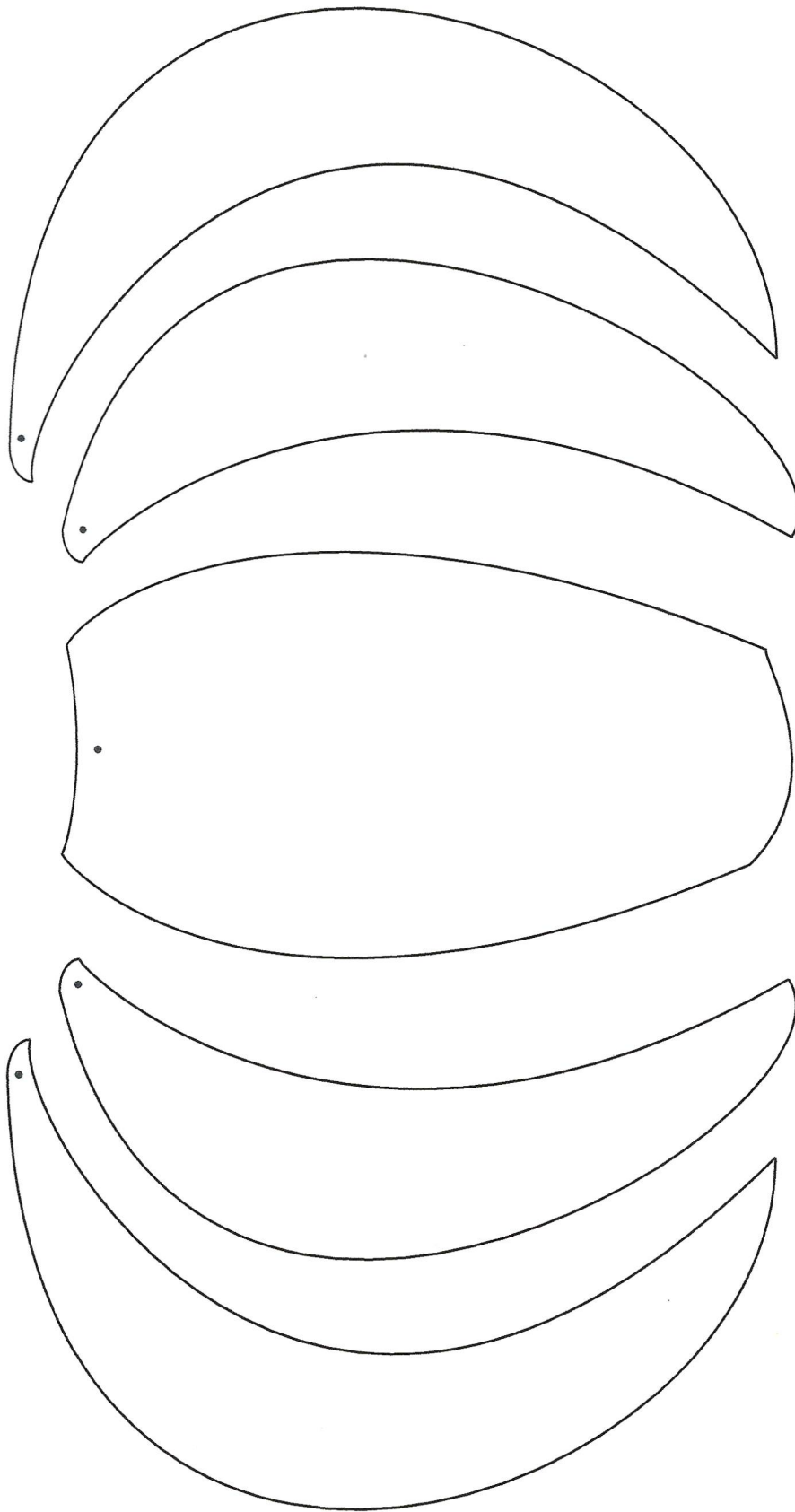
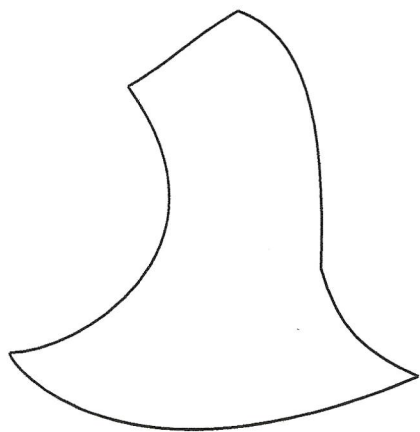
Short Pumpkin template
